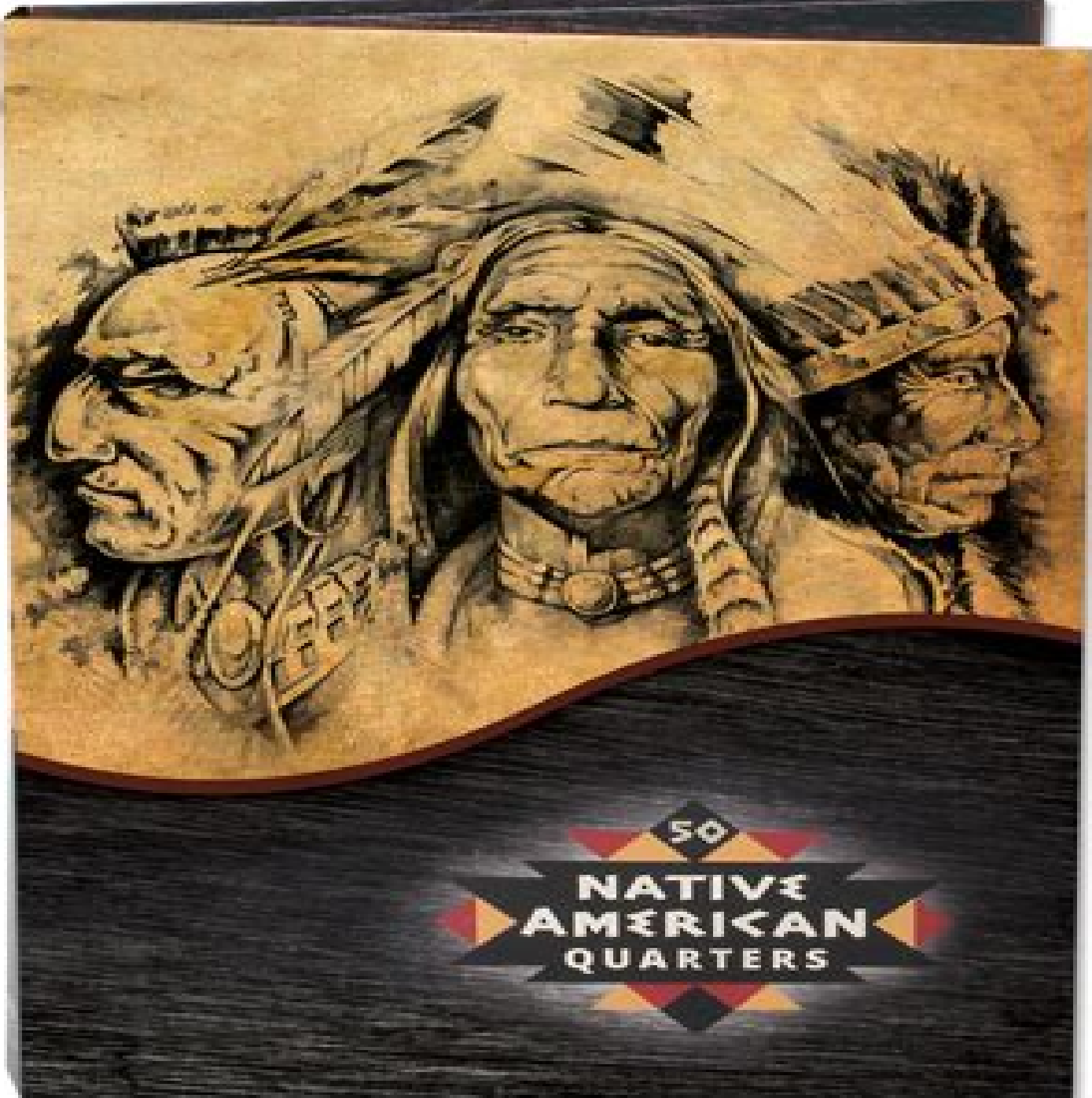

Native American Roots Christian Michael Gonzales, 2020-08-03 *Native American Roots: Relationality and Indigenous Regeneration Under Empire 1770-1859* explores the development of modern Indigenous identities within the settler colonial context of the early United States. With an aggressively expanding United States that sought to displace Native peoples, the very foundations of Indigeneity were endangered by the disruption of Native connections to the land. This volume describes how Natives embedded conceptualizations integral to Indigenous ontologies into social and cultural institutions like racial ideologies, black slaveholding, and Christianity that they incorporated from the settler society. This process became one vital avenue through which various Native peoples were able to regenerate Indigeneity within environments dominated by a settler society. The author offers case studies of four different tribes to illustrate how Native thought processes, not just cultural and political processes, helped Natives redefine the parameters of Indigeneity. This book will be of interest to students and scholars of early American history, Indigenous and ethnic studies, American historiography, and anthropology.

We see his struggles with alcoholism and personal misfortune, losing his first child and moving from one failed marriage to the next, coming to distrust many of the hands extended to him. Finally, we learn the details of his vigorous advocacy for Native American rights while he chased a Hollywood career and the truth behind the supposed reinstatement of his Olympic record in 1982. Here is the story, long overdue and brilliantly told, of a complex, iconoclastic, profoundly talented man whose life encompassed both tragic limitations and truly extraordinary achievements. The contributors argue for the centrality of nationhood and nation building in molding and concurrently blending the political, social, economic, and cultural strategies toward Native American self-definitions and self-determination. Included among the common themes is the significance of

space conceived both as traditional territory and colonial reservation in the current construction of Native national identity Whether related to historical memory and the narrativization of peoplehood the temporality of indigenous claims to sovereignty or the demarcation of successful financial assets as cultural and social emblems of indigenous space territory constitutes an inalienable and necessary element connecting Native American peoplehood and nationhood The creation and maintenance of Native American national identity have also overcome structural territorial impediments and may benefit from the inclusivity of citizenship rather than the exclusivity of ethnicity In all cases the political effectiveness of nationhood in promoting and sustaining sovereignty presupposes Native full participation in and control over economic development the formation of historical narrative and memory the definition of legality and governance

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Native Activism in Cold War America Daniel M. Cobb, 2008-10-24 The heyday of American Indian activism is generally seen as bracketed by the occupation of Alcatraz in 1969 and the Longest Walk in 1978 yet Native Americans had long struggled against federal policies that threatened to undermine tribal sovereignty and self determination This is the first book length study of American Indian political activism during its seminal years focusing on the movement's largely neglected early efforts before Alcatraz or Wounded Knee captured national attention Ranging from the end of World War II to the late 1960s Daniel Cobb uncovers the groundwork laid by earlier activists He draws on dozens of interviews with key players to relate untold stories of both seemingly well known events such as the American Indian Chicago Conference and little known ones such as Native participation in the Poor People's Campaign of 1968 Along the way he introduces readers to a host of previously neglected but critically important activists Mel Thom Tillie Walker Forrest Gerard Dr Jim Wilson Martha Grass and many others Cobb takes readers inside the early movement from D Arcy McNickle's founding of American Indian Development Inc and Vine Deloria Jr's tenure as executive director of the National Congress of American Indians to Clyde Warrior's leadership in the National Indian Youth Council and describes how early activists forged connections between their struggle and anticolonialist movements in the developing world He also describes how the War on Poverty's Community Action Programs transformed Indian Country by training bureaucrats and tribal leaders alike in new political skills and providing activists with the leverage they needed to advance the movement toward self determination This book shows how Native people who never embraced militancy and others who did made vital contributions as activists well before the American Indian Movement burst onto the scene By highlighting the role of early intellectuals and activists like Sol Tax Nancy Lurie Robert K Thomas Helen Peterson and Robert V Dumont Cobb situates AIM's efforts within a much broader

context and reveals how Native people translated the politics of Cold War civil rights into the language of tribal sovereignty Filled with fascinating portraits Cobb's groundbreaking study expands our understanding of American Indian political activism and contributes significantly to scholarship on the War on Poverty the 1960s and postwar politics and social movements

Indian Play Lisa K. Neuman, 2020-03-09 When Indian University now Bacone College opened its doors in Indian Territory now Oklahoma in 1880 it was a small Baptist institution designed to train young Native Americans to be teachers and Christian missionaries among their own people and to act as agents of cultural assimilation From 1927 to 1957 however Bacone College changed course and pursued a new strategy of emphasizing the Indian identities of its students and projecting often romanticized images of Indianness to the non Indian public in its fund raising campaigns Money was funneled back into the school as administrators hired Native American faculty who in turn created innovative curricular programs in music and the arts that encouraged their students to explore and develop their Native identities Through their frequent use of humor and inventive wordplay to reference Indianness Indian play students articulated the often contradictory implications of being educated Indians in mid twentieth century America In this supportive and creative culture Bacone became an Indian school rather than just another school for Indians In examining how and why this transformation occurred Lisa K Neuman situates the students Indian play within larger theoretical frameworks of cultural creativity ideologies of authenticity and counterhegemonic practices that are central to the fields of Native American and indigenous studies today
