within it work As a project manager you will need to realize that people are inseparable from process It is not only practical skills but leadership ability management skills and the ability to communicate that are imperative to successful projects Benjamin Franklin wrote For want of a nail the shoe was lost for want of a shoe the horse was lost and for want of a horse the rider was lost being overtaken and slain by the enemy all for want of care about a horseshoe nail A small problem overlooked in the early stages of project management can grow to be a critical failure in the later stages.
